

Union Court standing orders

The Union Court has a set of standing orders which it passes “in committee” as a whole which governs the internal administration of the Court. It deals with such matters as how cases are accepted, hearing procedure and so on. Certain provisions require the Trustee Board’s approval such as appeals, time limits outside hearings, restrictions on case acceptance and regulation of certain powers of compulsion.

The Union Court passed a number of relatively minor amendments at its last committee meeting last term, which it now proposes to the Trustee Board for its approval. Some of these are cross-reference corrections. These show as “tracked changes” on the attached document. Amendments to parts B, G and H require the Board’s approval: the others are included for information.

I commend these to you for your approval.
