4.6 ICSMSU CRICKET TOUR PROPOSAL

NOTED:

- a) The GSA Chair raised concerns with the nature of the activities in the proposed tour which are as follows.
 - i. The tour returns one week after the beginning of term, impacting on course work.
 - ii. 5 matches over 15 days suggest that far more time would be spent on HIV/AIDs work, which, while admirable, does not fall under the aims and objectives of the Cricket Club, and as such should not be funded.
- b) The Deputy President (Finance & Services) responded to the first point by arguing that it is not in the remit of the CSB to make decisions about student's use of their time. The ICSMSU President also reminded the board that due to the nature of the medical school, any period would mean that someone wanting to go on the trip would potentially miss teaching periods.
- c) The GSA Chair reiterated that part of the Aims and Objectives of Imperial College Union was to promote education.
- d) The Board came to the consensus that there was sufficient cricket in the tour to merit funding.
- e) The GSA Chair asked that he be in the minutes as still having concerns about his first issue.
