Academic and Welfare

One of the biggest challenges we faced this year was giving the academic and welfare representation a great big shake up. We hold weekly surgeries with the Academic Affairs Officer, Andreas Esau and Welfare Officer, Vicky Eriksson, on Wednesday lunchtimes for students to drop in and discuss any problems they have. Students can also drop in on any weekday lunchtime when we have a timetabled office rota so two or more members of the committee will always be in there. Last term we have been drawing up an informal paper-and-pen survey. This is based on the NSS picking out the questions where there has been most dissatisfaction and also adding several questions of our own based on services and accommodation as well as more department specific questions. I want to do an informal survey with students that are actually still present (instead of the NSS which asks students opinions when they are graduating). The survey will be conducted by year representatives, led by their department reps. Our goal is to specifically pick out real problems faced by Imperial students so that we can do something about it, not merely generate data.

Early on last term we got all of the year representatives together so we could make sure they knew what their role was and what was expected of them and also gain their feedback and ideas. It was actually quite overwhelming how many of them there are and our office was fit to burst, but nevertheless we found it to be quite a useful exercise.

Last term we had our most successful second hand book sale of recent years, selling over £1000 worth of books. The idea of the book sale is that we collect books from recent graduates and sell them onto freshers who want text books at reasonable prices and then the money made is given back to the original owners. There is an awful lot of work involved and Andreas and Vicky did it very well, so well done to them!

A new academic year and a new office

Our new office is absolutely fantastic. It has the space we need and is great for students to come along and meet us and for us to be able to hold our weekly executive meetings. There have been a few teething problems along the way though. These include our lack of internet access, phone line, lockable storage, general office paraphernalia and being unable to get to our office due to the connecting corridor from the Sherfield walkway being ceremoniously locked by security outside of normal college hours. However, all but the small matter of the phone line have been rectified. The problem we had with the internet is that the previous occupants of our office were on an external network and so new data sockets and cabling had to be installed. ICT were particularly useless about getting anything done in the first place, despite many desperate phone calls, and then they wanted the RCSU to fit the bill. I eventually came across Daniel Mulhall, from the blue cube, who has been superbly helpful and managed to get everything sorted. I strongly recommend him as a contact for any similar problems.

To equip our office with new storage and general office paraphernalia the original plan was to apply for a Harlington Trust Fund grant. Before the application form was handed in, a few members of ICU staff were asked if they knew of anyone that had any of the things we needed going spare. We were very lucky with the timing of that request and it turned out that several college departments were in fact moving offices that very week and so we were donated even more furniture and storage than we had hoped for and we were even able to pass some of it on (the medics now have a

very nice table in their common room!). Many thanks to Becca and Steve! So, no application to the Harlington Trust Fund was required and hopefully a society or club will be able to better spend any available money that they have.

Over the Christmas break swipe card access has been installed to the door of corridor that leads from the walkway to our office. This has the great advantage that we don't have to chase around security to let us in at weekends and in the evenings. We will shortly be getting an LED moving message sign to put in our window so that we can publicise events and activities to our outside view that looks onto the SAF and Chemistry buildings.

Regalia

New regalia is currently in the process of being ordered and when it arrives that shall be going on the ICU website for sale as there's been lots of interest in us getting our own hoodies. The RCSA have also been getting involved with digging out old regalia so we can use the traditional styles. Archives have also been very receptive to our queries and we hope to be going down there soon, not only to look at old regalia but to see what else is stored away.

Media

Broadsheet, the publication of the RCSU, has been of a very high calibre this term with a good number of contributors, many incriminating photographs and expert editing from Alex Guite even though he hasn't had access to our own copy of editing software due to the internet problems faced! So far three issues have been published and with the most recent two we have taken a novel approach to its distribution by copying LondonLite and thrusting copies of Broadsheet into the arms of unsuspecting scientists. This is something the whole executive have been involved with, as after all it is our main expense and mode of communication so we don't want any copies to go to waste.

The RCSU website has been not used to its maximum potential, but this is mainly due to the fact that there were no publicity and communications officers until late into last term and that a large proportion of our links died. Although they are now up and running and postings have become more regular. It has come in useful for online sign ups of the buddy scheme and football tournament teams. Most of our events are also published there. A new year representatives page has been created following our representatives meeting, as well as a very large Science Challenge section.
