

MANAGEMENT GROUP REPORT

SUMMARY OF CSC ACTIVITIES

This term has been a successful one for all ICSMSU Clubs & Societies and has gone without any problems for the majority. We are trying to ensure Clubs & Societies are as self sufficient as possible by promoting all sponsorship avenues, including utilising the St Mary's Association who want to support as many medic run events as they have the means to do so. We also had the Imperial College Healthcare Charity (formally Hammersmith Charitable Trust) confirm they will be sponsoring some of the medics clubs this year.

We want to continue to promote the cohesion of all our clubs including having a section in the ICSM Gazette dedicated to clubs and societies and using the fitted plasma screens in the Reynolds to celebrate successes and publicise events.

A major event in all the sport teams year is the annual Sports Dinner. After the success of the new venue of Planet Hollywood last year we are looking to return here again. The date has been booked for Tuesday 3rd May and the budget is currently being drawn up. We also wish to advertise it to alumni as well as current members. At the start of the year Fresher Sports Day at Teddington was a massive success compared with previous years with over 70 freshers turning up for a day run by Clubs & Societies.

FINANCIAL REPORT & MEMBERSHIP

Overall the vast majority of ICSMSU Clubs & Societies appear to be financially sound although currently many of the accounts have been frozen due to chairs failing to fill in the correct documentation. I am currently chasing this issue up with chairs and hope all will be resolved as soon as possible.

There have been a few issues with the allocation of the grants from last year;

- GradMed Society have not received £432 which they were awarded at RWB budgeting.
- ICSMSU Exec had our entire grant from last year paid into the contingency category, which has made it hard to spend the grant on what it should be spent on.

CLUB CONSTITUTION CHANGES

No clubs have requested to change their constitution.

NEW CLUBS

As a union we were pleased to welcome 3 more Clubs & Societies. These were the ICSM Dance Academy, the Hammersmith Student's Community and the Self-defence and Fitness Club. I have contacted all the chairs and asked them to fill out all the necessary documents as soon as possible.

EXEC ACTIVITIES

Fresher's Fortnight was a success financially with all events being well attended. Currently the union are trying to promote events other than sports night in the Reynolds such as comedy nights, salsa classes and a beer pong tournament.

RAG has started off the year very well; raising approximately £17,000 from its first two events. We had our annual Christmas Ball at Amika in High Street Kensington which also went very well.

This year we are also running a new conference, the Student Research & Communication Conference, which is proving to be popular with students.

CONTINGENCY AWARDS

So far this year no-one has applied for contingency funding although Lacrosse may consider applying after a miss-communication last year with the Sports Partnership Administrator resulting in them receiving a very steep £500 fine with BUCS. Any application will be dealt with by the ICSM Contingency fund.

TOURS

Hockey, Lacrosse and Light Opera have all been on tour so far this year. Both Badminton and Lacrosse received money from the tour fund with has greatly helped in the funding of their tours. Plans are also being made for netball, football, music and EMSA tours in the coming year.

SOCIAL

As with other years bops are being held in the Reynolds to aid clubs in raising money for specific causes and promoting their club. So far this year football, opera and men's hockey have hosted very successful bops all of which have raised between £500 and £1000 for the club.

PARTICULAR ISSUES

Some clubs have raised a few general issues;

 Women's Hockey – the 2nd team does not have a full set of kit. It has 11 shirts, 7 the new style and 4 the old football player style. It looks messy, unprofessional and the old shirts are very uncomfortable. Sport Imperial will not help which they consider to be extremely unfair considering that they girls play for this university every week and deserve a proper kit (which other teams get free).

- Muslim Medics problems with storage. They ask if it would be possible to have some space in the SAF dedicated for this purpose.
- Waterpolo lack of funding which continues to not allow them to afford a coach. This
 restricts them to only one regular training session a week due to Charing Cross Sports Club
 charges of £80 per one hour session.

FACILITIES/STORAGE

The storage space for clubs and societies in the basement in the Reynolds was cleaned out and reorganised at the start of this academic year and will hopefully be kept in a reasonable state. I will be checking this out a few times each term.

LARGE EVENTS

Some of the events hosted this term by ICSMSU clubs and societies include;

- Trauma conference. This was the 5th annual conference hosted by the ICSMSU surgical society and was a great success. The tickets sold out within days of going on sale, and the event was attended by medical students from around the country and in some cases the world.
- Muslim Medics held the PotMed event, which saw over 200 potential medics from all across London head down to Imperial in late September. The society tried to guide them through the rigorous application system and simultaneously encourage widening participation.
- Medsin held their annual Medsin Fayre. They invited all their projects and campaigns and
 The Global Health Forum to give a brief presentation of their activities. There was a brief
 mingle session afterwards where students could ask questions and sign up to individual
 projects and Campaigns and get more information on GHF. This evening was very successful
 and a great opportunity to meet the interested members.

THE DAILY MAIL ARTICLE

This deserves a mention as it has had a big impact on our operations. For those of you that don't know, an undercover Daily Mail reporter came in to the Reynolds on one of our weekly sports nights, took photographs and interviewed people about the general drinking culture. The article was published on New Year's Day.

As a Union we are working our hardest to resolve the situation and are working with people from Imperial College Union who have been a tremendous help.
