Table Football Status

Background

Table Football is not currently dormant as the RCC voted to keep the society out of dormancy during the 2010 December dormancy review. The society, to date, has 16 full members and if the society continues to have fewer than 20 members a vote will take place to decide if the club enters dormancy. A meeting to discuss the lack of popularity will take place on the 10th May at 12pm.

What is believed to have caused the lack of popularity?

Table Football Society has been popular and attracted many people during the fresher's fair, however due to the small room available, there is much trouble to accommodate more than 10 people. The main issue is the lack of space and ventilation. To remedy this, the society managed to secure a few bookings of the neighbouring meeting rooms to set up our extra table(s). However as these room bookings were only available weeks after the fresher's fair and free taster sessions, many people had lost interest due to the lack of space. We tried to secure room bookings for the spring term but all rooms had already been booked in advance. On many occasions during our weekly sessions we have found these meeting rooms empty and have been frustrated with much lost opportunity.

The society has brought up these issues with next year's committee and the new president will follow up on room bookings more efficiently from the beginning of the autumn term.

View on closing the society

The society should not be closed and have a second chance to run next year. The lessons of this year have been learnt and passed on to the committee next year. Table football will be nominated for dormancy during the last RCC dormancy review.
