There have been some huge improvements to the response rate over the past two week, mainly due to increased communication with Dep Reps and DepSoc Chairs and providing increased support to the Departments which have been struggling to get students to fill out the survey. I am confident that we can achieve an overall participation of >60% and >65% in most departments. The survey runs until the end of April.
