ADMINISTRATIVE ISSUES

1. OSC Committee Issues

- Debt incurred due to oversight by the previous OSC Treasurer.
- Sports Officer is out of the country for this entire term. Junior Treasurer has been appointed to fill in the role of the Sports Officer for Autumn Term.

2. Management Group Meetings

- Two management group meetings were held on 14th October and 14th November 2011.
- Quorum was met on both occasions.
- Aside from the administrative issues, Minnah from CV2012 was also present to give a brief presentation on the scheme.

3. Clubs & Societies Documentation

- 31/40 societies successfully met all requirements.

- Final warning has been issued through emails to the concerned societies and dormancy review will commence at the next Management Group OGM in early Spring.

4. Clubs & Societies Reports

5. Welsh Society Issue

6. Inactive Club Membership

- Found 2 societies (Canadian (1 Member) and Mexican (1 Member)) with paid membership even though they are inactive.
- OSC Treasurer to sort out refund.

ACTIVITES AND EVENTS

1. OSC Football World Cup

- Held on the 26th of November at Westway Sports Complex.
- Total of 16 signed up but 4 societies pulled out before the event. Remaining 4 slots were filled up by larger societies which were interested in sending 2 teams.
- Spanish society crowned OSC Football World Cup Champions.

2. OSC World Summit

- Inaugural event aimed at bringing together student leaders from various nationalities to celebrate the diversity at Imperial College London.
- To be held on the 6th of December at Union Dining Hall.
- Total of 15 societies signed up.
- Event fully sponsored by the Diversity Team at Imperial. Estimated expenditure of £2000. Full dinner and entertainment provided for the evening.

3. OSC International Festival – 'The Melting Pot'

- Inaugural event aimed at allowing societies to promote their cultures and raise funds through selling food and products. Societies can also take the opportunity to promote their cultural shows which are mostly held in the Spring term.
- To be held on the 25th of January at Beit Quad (Union Dining Hall and lawn area).

4. OSC International Night

- To be held on the 6th of March at the Great Hall.
