SUMMARY OF CSC ACTIVITIES

This first term has been a highly successful one for all ICSMSU Clubs & Societies and has gone without any problems for the majority. We are trying to ensure Clubs & Societies are as self sufficient as possible by promoting all sponsorship avenues, including utilising the St Mary's Association who want to support as many medic run events as they have the means to do so. We are also lucky to receive support from the ICSM Alumni Association which is rapidly expanding under the brilliant guidance of our dedicated alumni committee and SU alumni officer, Laura Wilkinson.

We want to continue to promote the cohesion of all our clubs including having a section in the ICSM Gazette dedicated to clubs and societies and using the brand new media advertising screens in the Reynolds to celebrate successes and publicise events.

Our first event of the year was Freshers' Sports Day at Teddington Sports Grounds which was a massive success with almost eighty freshers turning up (a new record) for a day of fun, food and activities run by our sports clubs. I would personally like to thank all the club captains and their extremely able committees for their help, organisation and enthusiasm and ensuring that all our freshers felt welcome and included – without them this day could not have happened!

FINANCIAL REPORT & MEMBERSHIP

Overall the vast majority of ICSMSU Clubs & Societies appear to be financially sound although currently many of the accounts have been frozen due to chairs failing to fill in the correct documentation. NEW CLUBS

Despite a number of people contacting me to propose new club ideas, we have not actually had any of these come into fruition yet. ICSM Vision, under the guidance of Ann Sturdy, is looking to convert from an ICSMSU activity into a society in its own right.

EXEC ACTIVITIES

Over the summer months we have seen the birth and expansion of the new ICSMSU Website following the last sites collapse last academic year. Many of our officers have dedicated countless hours into its development with particular thanks going to ICSMSU Welfare Officer Neeraj Kalra, ICSMSU Treasurer Peter Davis, ICSMSU Academic Officer Year 1,2 &GEP Steven Tran, ICSMSU President Suzie Rayner and the multiple ICSM Club and Society Chairs and their committees who have helped get it off the ground. We are very grateful to ICSMSU Secretary Seetha Muthalagappan who keeps it updated with ICSMSU and club and society events throughout the year.

Fresher's Fortnight was an extraordinary success financially with all events being extremely well attended. We were also extremely lucky to have agreed a sponsorship arrangement with Domino's Pizza who were a welcomed feature at many of our events handing out discounts and free pizza! Our gratitude goes to ICSMSU Treasurer Peter Davis and ICSMSU President Suzie Rayner for their hard work securing this deal. Currently the union are trying to promote events other than sports night in the Reynolds and these have been extremely successful. Reynolds Pong lives on strong as well as a range of quiz nights, club and society events and of course our infamous Friday night club and society run Bops.

RAG has started off the year very well; raising a record breaking £17,000 from the first event alone. Under the leadership of ICSMSU RAG Chair Elisabeth Kostov, they have done a fantastic job galvanising freshers to participate in their events and coming up with fresh ideas to support their chosen charity, The Teenage Cancer Trust. We wish them every success in the organisation and execution of RAG dash next term as well as RAG week.

Vision has also been a huge success holding both its Junior Conference (aimed at year 10-12 school students) who may have not considered applying to medicine as well as its Senior Conference (aimed at year 13 school students) who are applying to medicine this or in the following academic year. Vision aims to support students from our local state schools who are interested in studying medicine, but lack the appropriate support at school and to give those applying continued support throughout their application.

CONTINGENCY AWARDS

So far this year no-one has applied for contingency funding.

TOURS

Netball, Football, Rugby, Men and Ladies Hockey, Music Society, Lacrosse, Waterpolo, Darts and Light Opera have all been on tour so far this year. Unfortunately only Lacrosse were successful in receiving funding from the CSB Spring Tours fund and we are hoping to improve both the quality of applications and the number for the next tour funding period.

SOCIAL

As with other years bops are being held in the Reynolds to aid clubs in raising money for specific causes and promoting their club. So far this year; Football, Light Opera and Boat Club have hosted very successful bops all of which have risen between £1500 and £2500.

PARTICULAR ISSUES

There has only been one major issue so far:

- SubAqua – in the Summer Term last year SubAqua were merged with IC Underwater Club without consultation of the two SubAqua club presidents. They successfully appealed against this decision to this years ICU Exec who supported their claim that the merger was unfair and they have now taken their case to the trustee board who met recently. It was decided that a decision could not be made as to whether or not the merger should be reversed until both clubs produce a list of pros and cons for the merger. SubAqua are keen to get their appeal accepted by the Trustee board and they are currently operating as a separate club and have run a number of trips as well as completing all their paperwork and reaching their membership targets for the year well before the deadlines.

FACILITIES/STORAGE

Clubs and Societies continue to use space in the Reynolds Building for storage. So far there have been no reports of any problems in this area and it will be continued to be monitored.
