#### **Higher Education Policy**

### **Background**

- 1. At the end of this Sabbatical Term the Higher Education Funding Policy shall expire.
- 2. Instead of refreshing this document with elements of the White Paper Response we felt it was better to create a document that made clear the broad beliefs of the student body. This will have several advantages:
  - A. A document of this kind does not currently exist;
  - B. The majority of the consultations for the UK Government happen in the summer. Though we typically perform surveys, it is useful to have broad principles to refer to;
  - C. Sabbatical Officers can achieve a good amount of work during the summer and this document can help them with this.
- Each consultation the Union makes for an external organisation, such as the UK Government, should be established as an Appendix to this policy. Therefore this document has the following Appendices:
  - A. The Higher Education Funding Policy, as the Union's Response to the Browne Review (Nov, 2010),
  - B. The Response to the 2011 Higher Education White Paper (Sept, 2011),
  - C. Post-Qualifications Admissions Response for the Universities and Colleges Admissions Services [UCAS] (Nov, 2011),
  - D. Postgraduate Education Enquiry of the Higher Education Commission (April, 2012)

#### **Beliefs**

Imperial College Union believes:

- 1. The only barrier to getting a place at a University should be academic attainment. As such; no person should be hindered due to gender, ethnic origin, country or region of origin, sexuality, religion or financial background.
- 2. Financial Support, in the form of a Student Load, should be available to Postgraduate (Taught) Students.
- 3. The Widening Participation Agenda (Outreach) is a positive move to increasing social mobility and should be fully supported by Universities.
- 4. Fee waivers, as part of a bursary package, provide a smaller benefit to students than allowing them the freedom to choose where the money goes.
- 5. Students should be allowed the opportunity to repay their student loans early.
- 6. Scholarships should be widely available to ensure the very best students have the opportunity to get an Imperial College degree.
- 7. Teaching must be a priority for all academics of Imperial College and used as a criteria for progression.
- 8. Students should not be charged interest on their student loans whilst undertaking their studies; whilst being an Undergraduate, Postgraduate (Taught) and Postgraduate (Research)

student.

9. Sandwich Courses, such as a Year Abroad or Year in Industry, provide invaluable opportunities to the students of Imperial College.
