### Imperial College Union OSC Report

#### **Membership**

- The OSC has received 2005 members so far this year with 8/39 societies not reaching the minimum limit of 20 members yet.
- Only 3 of these are a great concern: Bangladesh, Palestinian and Vietnamese Society.
- Refer to appendix 1 for a more detailed breakdown.

#### **Clubs and Societies**

- 33/39 societies completed all their requirements successfully.
- 36/39 societies submitted their autumn term report.
- Lots of nagging was required in order to get most of the soceities to complete their requirements. Some societies couldn't complete them due to technical problems. Examples are Korean, Nigerian and Russian.
- Refer to appendix 1 for more detail.
- Lots of varity in the activities carried out by the societies. The most interesting ones include language lessons, cultural dancing nights and traditional day events. To know what each society did seperately, refer to Appendix 2.
- Interesting to see societies liaising with other universities.

#### **Administrative Issues**

- The Romanian and Kenyan society were taken out of dormancy at the start of the year.
- The Vietnamese and Bangladeshi Society are performing very poorly and are likely to be put into dormancy by the end of the term.
- Spanish president wishes to re-sign. According to her, it is taking up too much time. I attempted to convince her to re-consider but she has already made up her mind.

#### **OSC Executive Committee Updates & Issues**

- Two Ordinary General Meetings (OGMs) held, one on the 18<sup>th</sup> October and one on the 14<sup>th</sup> November.
- · Quorum met on both occasions.
- The aim of the first OGM was to go through some of the essential training material. Societies generally find this useful and so it's note worthy for other Management Groups.
- Had to appoint a new secretary at the start of the year due to the previous one leaving us.
- We started the year with a debt due to a mistake that occurred two years ago in our management group. As a result, we have been trying very hard to raise money for International Night (I-Night) through sponsors as well as other fundraising events.
- We have weekly drop-in sessions to help societies with any adminstrative/financial issues, however, they have not been used at all.

- We welcome the newly formed English and Italian society to our management group.
- The CommonWealth Forum, a group of students aiming to promote culture by bringing everybody together, are going to become a subcommittee in our management group.
- We congratulate the Japanese and the French society for successfuly applying for tours
- We have applied to the IC Trust to get some funding for I-night but are still waiting for a response.
- We have been meeting regularly with the Head of International Support, Sharon, and Union International Officer, Jialin, to discuss international student issues and plan more events.

#### **OSC Past Events**

- Many societies are making use of the flag poll at the Union. We can conclude that the idea was very successful.
- This year we have organised international week so far. During the week, societies were encouraged to go around Imperial College and promote their cultural through various events. These included movie nights as well as food related events.
- The execs organised two fund raising events during international week. These were Queen's Tower tours. We had about 120 students go up and over a 100 were turned away. £500 was raised. Hoping to open the towers again in our second international week taking place in February.
- The culmination of International Week was the OSC Football World Cup. As usual, very popular with 16 societies participating (Over 100 members). Everybody enjoyed the event and soceities asked for a similar basketball event.
- We congratulate the Iraqi society for winning the tournament the second time in its 4 year existence. They were awarded £70 for their efforts.
- An article about international week was written in Felix to congratulate all the student participation.

#### **OSC Future Events**

- We are hoping to host International Week Part 2 in February.
- It is going to begin with melting pot, an event that allows societies to cook and sell their food to imperial students, providing them with the opportunity to promote culture.
- Societies will again be encouraged to run their own events to promote diversity.
- We are hoping to raise more funds by opening the Queen's Tower.
- International Night, taking place on the 9th February will be the culmination. It promises to be a gread night with a huge variety including a cyproit skit, belly dancing and a japanese pantomine.
