Background:

 The Management Group structure continues as a standing issue that requires action (18 June 2013 CSPB and 8 October 2013 CSPB)

Discussion

- It is a standing belief that the Management Structure does not function as well as it could and needs redeveloping
- The definition of the core purposes of a Management Group should be decided, to include:
 - Administration
 - o Representation and Support
 - Forum for Collaboration
- Working from this definition, the Management Group structure should be considered and redeveloped to ensure all criteria are fulfilled
- The discussion of potential new Management Group structures shall continue from that originally proposed in the June 2013 CSPB paper
- As of September, the DPCS and DPFS discussed a system restructure as if there
 were none currently in place. This is a potential fresh starting point for discussion.
 The discussion led to an approximate suggested breakdown of:
 - Educational (30), Faith (13), Overseas (44), Charity (30), Competitive Team Sport (33), Individual Sport (33) to also include Martial Arts (13), Recreational Activity (32) to include Musical Performance (15), Appreciation (15), ICSMSU (currently unconfirmed), Departmental Societies to remain with Constituent Unions

Action

 To form a working group from the CSPB membership to take the restructure process forwards
