RAG has had a very successful term thus far, with all fundraising events running a profit and an increased engagement with our membership. We hope this will continue throughout RAG week and the rest of the year. All committee positions are now filled (:D). I have met with all our clubs.

RAG EXEC

- 1.) Non-fundraising Events thus far:
 - RAG Conference (York, 26-28 August). This was a great opportunity to meet other RAG committees, and we used the opportunity to investigate collaborative events. The most developed of these thus far is our plan for a RAG raid in partnership with Oxford RAG. The Seminars attended on Fundraising Law, running a jailbreak and the charities fair were all useful in choosing our events and charities for the year

 - Management Group Restructure: we are engaging with the DPCS on the topic o the restructure, specifically with respect to the position of charities within the Union.
