5th and 6th year Medics Funding Problems

I have been working with Union Staff to support the ICSMSU Welfare Officer in their campaign to increase the support provided to 5th/6th year Medics. We have found that currently, students who started from 2007 through to 2011 will face a £3,000 decrease in funding between their 4th year and 5th year support. Worryingly, for the students who started 2012 and later, this figure will rise to a decrease of up to £6,000 in funding for a student progressing from 4th year to 5th year (this will occur in Summer 2016). The survey results are gravely concerning, and we are working with the School of Medicine to take action on this.

Media

I have engaged with Student Media, where inappropriate.

College Outreach

Pascal and I where involved in the College Outreach Department's strategy away day. This involved a discussion around the way we engage with our unlikely applicants at the pre-application stage.
