# Motion to Prevent the Union's Lobbying of its Own Members

Proposer: Oliver Ford (OM UG Engineering); Seconder: Sina Lari (Chair, SCC)

### **Union Notes:**

1. To further its Objects, which include but are not limited to "promoting the interests and welfare of Students" (C 4.1) the Union may "seek to influence public opinion; and ... influence governmental and other bodies and institutions" (C 5.4.2-3)

#### **Union Believes:**

- 1. The Union has a responsibility to defend its Members' interest in legislative matters affecting them as or their welfare while they are students
- 2. In democracy
- 3. The Union does not exist to pool votes on significant external matters; particularly where the impact is wider-reaching than student affairs alone
- 4. The Union's Members form a diverse group with a range of sometimes opposing interests:
  - a. who should not feel pressured to vote against their own opinion in the interest of the Union or fellow Members
  - b. an official Union stance may place undue pressure on Members to vote 'in line' with that stance
  - c. a campaign affiliated or sponsored by the Union would have no other purpose but to serve such 'pressure'

#### **Union Resolves:**

- 1. Not to lobby its Members to vote in a specific direction:
  - a. prior to, or in any way anticipation of
    - i. general or by-elections
    - ii. national referenda
  - b. by any form of communication with, near, or on behalf of its Members; regardless of whether the outcome would benefit
    - i. The Union
    - ii. (Other) Members of the Union
  - c. and to amend the Constitution to that effect by
    - i. the addition to E. Powers of A1 below
- 2. To support campaigns for each option equally, or not at all; ensuring:
  - a. campaigns are equally funded
  - b. campaigns are, as far as reasonable, presented with equal gusto
  - c. the lack of a volunteer for one stance should not mean a single Union-funded campaign goes ahead
- 3. Not to take a public stance on matters of the resolved (R 1.a) nature
  - a. and to amend the Constitution to that effect by
    - i. the amendment to D. Object 4.1 to add the exclusion A2 below

- 4. The Union's objects are the advancement of education of Students at Imperial College London for the public benefit by:
  - 4.1. promoting the interests and welfare, except in matters relating to or in anticipation of [R 1.a], of Students at Imperial College London during their course of study and representing, supporting, and advising students;
  - 4.2. being the recognised representative channel between Students and Imperial College London and any other external bodies; and
  - 4.3. providing social, cultural, sporting, and recreational activities and forums for discussions and debate for the personal development of its Students
