At around 2000, student felt a painful scratch on their foot (were wearing ballerina pumps) and quickly put it away. Immediately after, student saw a small animal, probably a mouse, running away from their seat row towards the UCH stage.</p> <p>Student told boyfriend, who was sitting next to them, and he suggested a call to 111 (non-emergency NHS phone number). Student did so, and was asked a series of questions and redirected to the nearest emergency department, and told to get there before an hour had past. Student's boyfriend and student went by taxi and got to the Chelsea and Westminster hospital emergency department where student was first seen by a nurse and then by a doctor. During the evening, student's boyfriend told me he had also seen an animal, probably a mouse, in the UCH that evening.</p> <p>As the skin was not broken, the doctor did not prescribe any treatment, but asked student to remain vigilant and observe the scratch for 24 hours. If foot had changed until then, the doctor told student to go to their GP. What 111 did tell student to do right after the scratch, was to thoroughly wash foot with water and soap, to cover the scratched area with something until they saw a doctor, and not to put any antiseptic on the scratch.</p> <p>The scratch has not evolved, it is healing and it is not painful and student reports all is fine.</p>	Estates team informed and pest control measures requested.

				South Kensington	<p>UCH one of the pieces of secondary glazing detached itself from its frame, and began a rapid descent towards the floor. The aforementioned crew member was not struck by the falling glazing, but was within a metre or two of it as it fell. Had the glazing shattered (a not unlikely prospect), they would likely have been hit by a spray of the shattering material. Fortunately, the glazing did not shatter but instead fell to the floor as a whole unit.</p> <p>The glazing fell with no provocation - the window was open, as has been the case upon several occasions previously, with no issues. The fact that it is capable of doing this is obviously concerning, given the use of the space by multiple users, including small children.</p> <p>All other windows in the UCH possess this secondary glazing.</p>	of Student Experience & Services. Lab ACEX 111 which shares a wall and a door with the garage was severely affected.</p> <p>The Safety Team evacuated all the remaining occupants of these levels.</p> <p>The Safety Team with the help of Security Officers went in to investigate and found the garage in a very unsafe state - cylinders were found free standing and unsecured and a heater was left on by the leaking petrol.</p> <p>With the help of Security, the Safety Team used sand to absorb the petrol which had leaked onto the asphalt and towards the drains and created a dam between the garage and the asphalt in order to catch any more petrol from the fire engine.
