# 9. JISC data & SOLE Survey

- a. Presentation from Camille
- b. Learning analytics aim to improve education and support students
- c. Providing more personalised and tailored learning
- d. Support enhancement of learning and teaching
- e. Been trying different platforms to connect to data through JISC
- f. Unifying data platform way to connect all College datasets around student learning
- g. Developing policy and ethics guidelines, ways for students to access their own data
- h. George what is the primary goal?
- i. Camille providing a more tailored experience to students. The idea behind it is that students can see their own data.
- j. Julia overall picture in terms of course/cohort, would that be used to fuel analysis of teaching and the student experience?
- k. Camille Yes and some provides an immediate staff dashboard too and engagement of students. Could take intervention steps
- 1. Julia Only concern with personal granular approach is separating students into bands of engagement. Maybe it would be better to set minimal thresholds of engagement. Ranking approach might do more harm to the personal tutor/student interaction.
- m. Camille setting expectations to students so they know how it works and what to expect
- n. George what happens if results are 'scary'?
- o. Camille that would raise workload concerns over students/highlights problems which staff could then deal with
- p. James Will learning analytics results be publicised?
- q. Camille not really done at high level, but more on course basis. As an outsider it would be difficult to make sense of a EEE module for example, you would need to understand the context. Wouldn't necessarily be done on a College level. We want students to be aware of what is happening, although most of it is covered by the data policy
- r. Julia for analytics in medicine it would work better in departments. Not sure how well it would work in later years of study when medicine students go on placement
- s. Julia could lecturers upload feedback forms online with the online lecture slides/recordings?

### 10. Module Evaluation Questionnaires

- a. Students have told us they have too many surveys and would like a better way to know what's been done with their feedback to college. Therefore, the college has redesigned end of term surveys that aim to provide staff with actionable insights.
- b. Piloted survey in spring 2021 in four different departments.
- c. Main difference is we no longer provide ratings of overall satisfaction which is happening nationally too, along with individual ratings of teachers. We have some



- working groups working on this project too. One of the main things that will happen from a student perspective is that it can be publicly shared, whereas this couldn't before due to ratings on individuals
- d. Julia will this be standardised across the whole of College?
- e. Camille at the moment it is the same across FoNS and Eng. Plan to offer optional banks of questions. Plan to develop asking those in future years. Do you think as students not being able to rate lecturers is a problem?
- f. George spoke about this in our faculty meeting and the value for students on surveys comes from where we can comment on our lecturers. Provides complications where they have more than one lecturer for one module. Mixed views.
- g. Camille could use text box to talk about this. One of the main concerns was the response rate for modules. If you get 5 responses out of 200 it's hard to make a quality judgement.
- h. George Is it fair to say a lot of it is about protecting lecturers? Now lecturers can't have individual feedback it's hard for them to know what to improve
- Julia Depends how it would be in the final stage. We had things for the whole year rather than modules. It depends how this will be ironed out and made more specific. In terms of previous SOLE the main issue was that the SOLE always got sent out really late (usually a month after). Once they receive this they are busy with other things.
- j. Camille we would have the facility to send this out at different times in future. Are asking for more feedback on the process too. Definitely encourage you to get students to fill it out this year. Reps, please get in touch through the rep structure. We are trying to make a system that works and represents the student voice.
- k. James concerns I got were on accessibility too as SOLE was based on Windows 98. The new one will hopefully be better.
- I. George Regarding the SOLE survey it's frustrating because we go to all the meetings but we feel everyone is disagreeing
