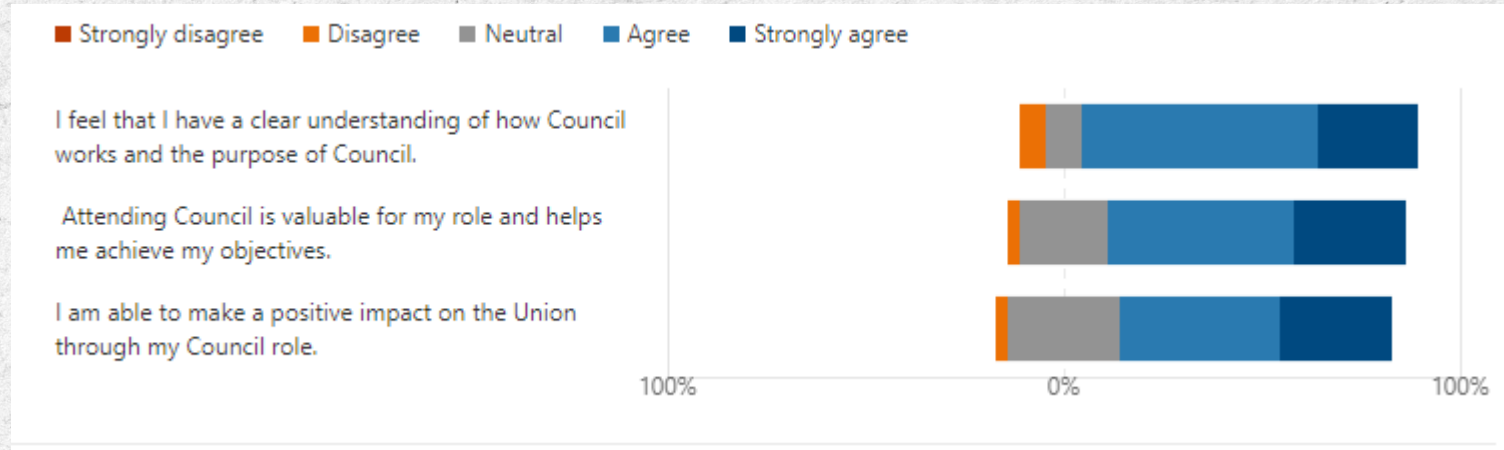

- Question – how does (lack of) anonymity affect response?

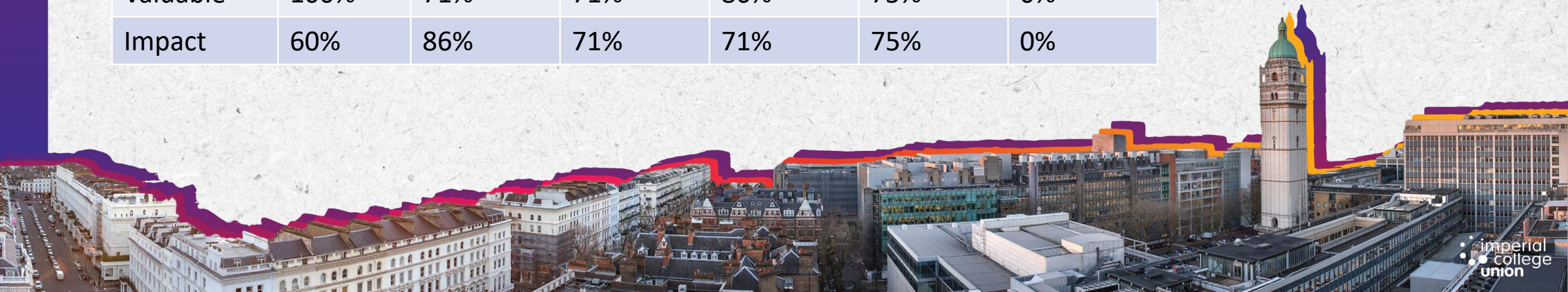


Q1

- 69% agree – Positive impact

Q3

- **Have you brought a paper to Council?**
 - 9/32 – yes
- Many students cited not having yet found an issue relevant to discuss. Others suggested they were too busy.
- Some suggestion that Council members might be more aware of issues if they spoke to more students / had better access to student views, or if students knew to approach them with issues.
- Some suggestion that it was not clear what issues were relevant to Council, vs what would be better discussed in other fora.
- Some comments around papers / training – paper structure could be simpler, there could be a paper template / example papers, info about papers could be more visible on the website, there could be ways of getting feedback on draft papers before submission.

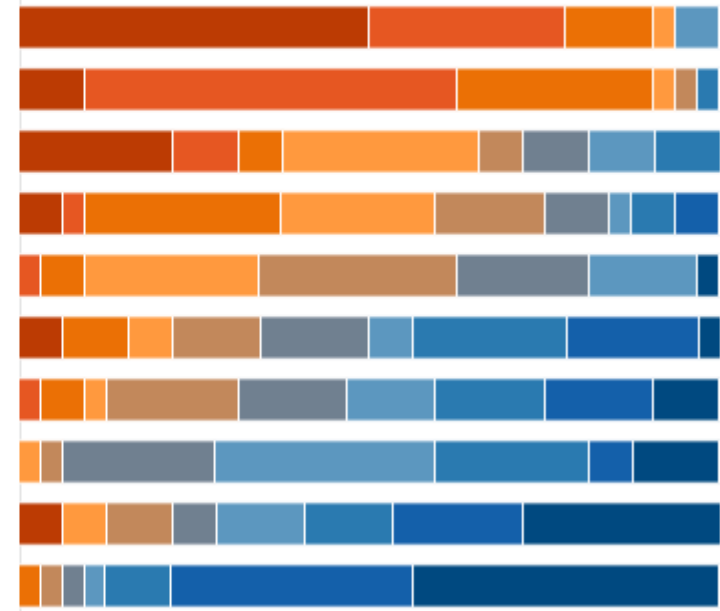

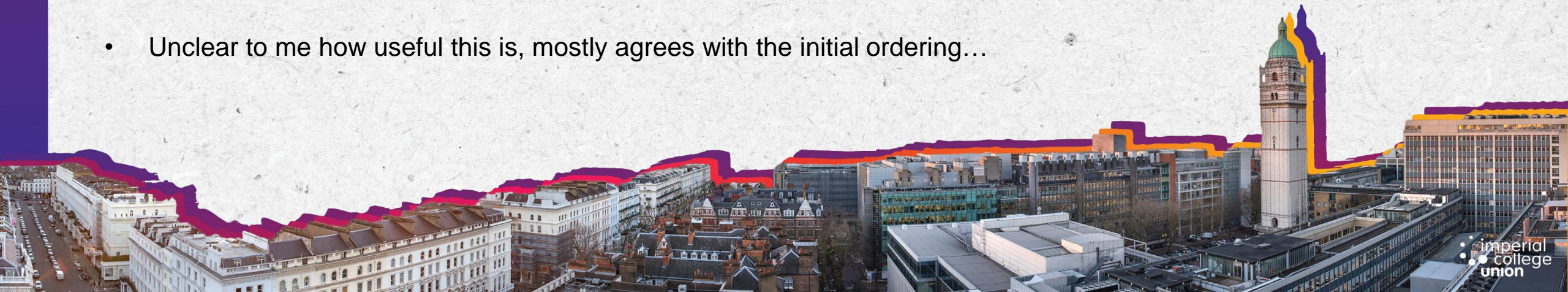

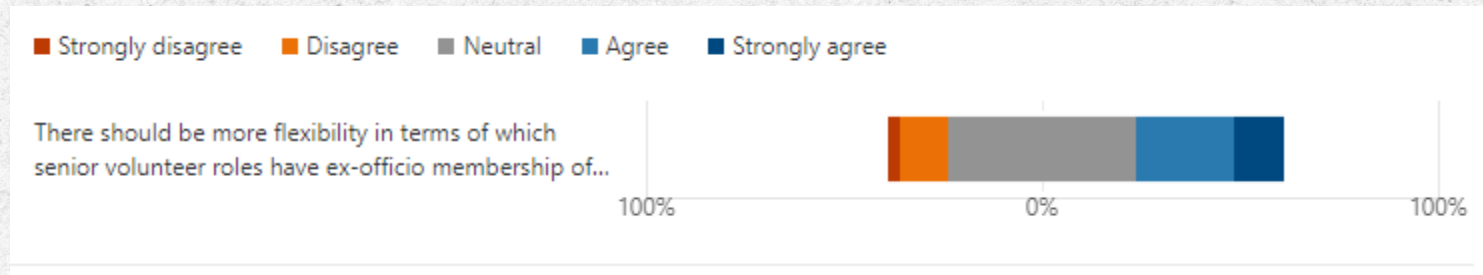


- Unclear to me how useful this is, mostly agrees with the initial ordering...

11. How many times have you been unable to physically attend a Council meeting which you would have been able to join remotely, if that were an option?

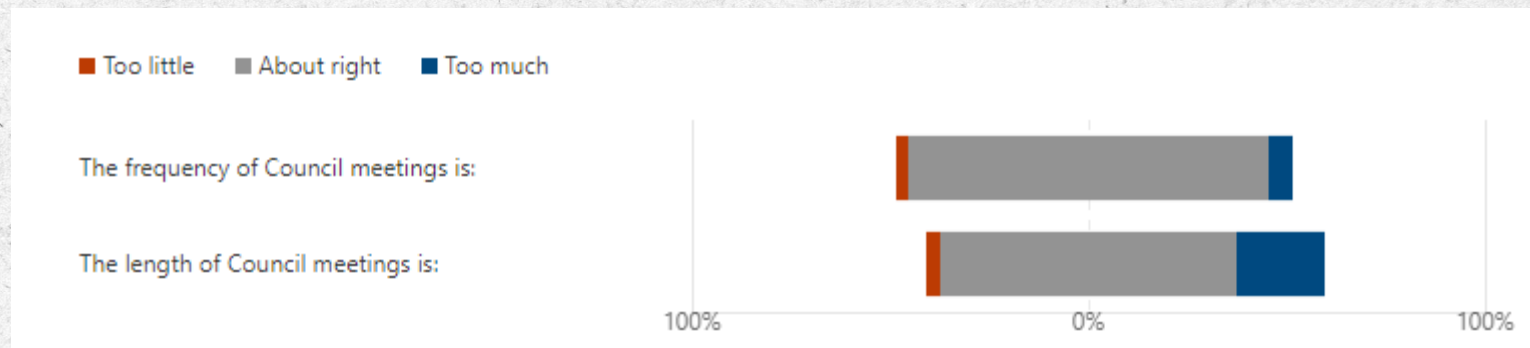

- Frequency and length of meetings – mostly about right, though 22% prefer longer meetings vs 3% preferring shorter meetings.



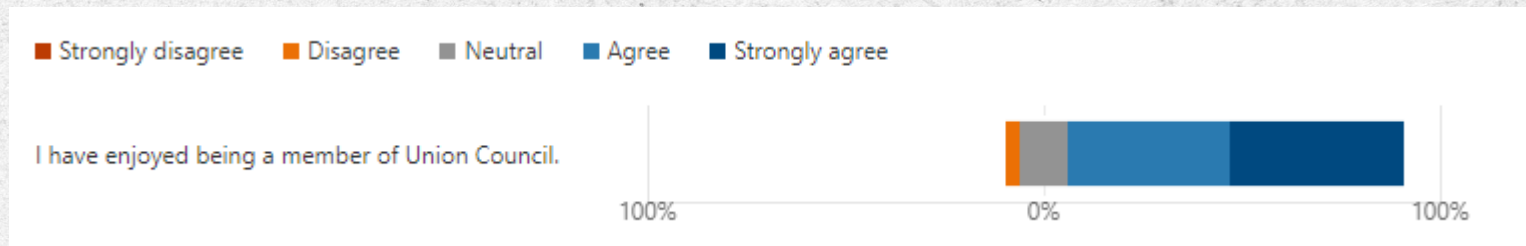
